WHAT I LEARNED IN THIS COURSE?



WHAT I LEARNED ABOUT MYSELF?

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Discovering my identity: One of the most valuable things I learned in this course was discovering myself through the VIA survey. When I did this survey, I learned what my top 5 strengths were. These strengths surprised me, as I expected to have different ones. However, after reflecting on the survey results, I realized that these strengths are indeed part of who I am and what I value in life. It also helped me to appreciate myself, as I always think about my weaknesses and try to improve, ignoring my strengths and neglecting the importance of knowing both strengths and weaknesses.

Another activity that helped me discover my identity—I remember well—that we did in class was writing down 10 things that express who I am. I remember that this was challenging for me to think of 10 things that reflect my personality. At that time, I could only think of some general aspects, such as being a student at AUC and an Egyptian citizen, to complete the 10 characteristics, although I know that my identity is more than that. However, when Dr. Maha asked us to eliminate the five least important traits, I found it easy. It was easy because I eliminated the general things that I wrote, leaving only the important ones. This helped me to think of my true character, which has been shaped over time. Therefore, after I finished this class that day, I asked myself why it was really hard for me to write 10 things about myself. Then I figured out that it is okay not to know a lot, but I knew new things about myself, my values, and my character. That is why, I think that discovering myself is a ong journey that is still continuing with me in the future.



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IN MY ACADEMIC LIFE

Informal writing skills: I always used to write formally, even when it came to writing reflection. However, I learned that writing blogs and reflecting should be more personalized, as we are expressing ourselves freely. Although I write reflections a lot in other courses, I experienced how we can write freely in this course. Teaching through games: Teaching has been one of the things that I have been doing for a couple of years. Yes, I teach children in my church. But I have never realized that we can actually learn through games. One thing Dr. Maha mentioned to Dana when we were planning for our school visit is to never do something that has no meaning. Not only that, I also started to use this method in my presentations, where I start my introduction with a little game that introduces my topic. It impacted my well-being, as I was going to class every day full of pressure from the workload that I had. However, by sharing how we felt at the beginning of the class, I felt less stressed. Also, this course was eye-opening to me as it shed light on the idea of microaggression. This was one of the new things that I learned in class, especially when we did a role-play about it. The first thing I would like to show them is the <u>digital</u> narrative game that Janna, Dana, and I created. The reason I want them to play it is that we worked hard to create a game that gives meaning to its players. As I mentioned before, I liked the idea of learning through games. The second thing that I would like to show someone is some of my blog posts on school visits, such as the <u>first school visit</u> and the <u>final school visit</u>. I want to show them how I was able to discover and overcome challenges through this journey. They express how learning can come in the form of activities, not just studying material and exams. The last thing that I would like to show them, or that I actually showed them, is the plot where I grew plants. I would like to show them the weeds that we remove so that the plants can grow healthy, which helps our health. Indeed, one day I was crying because I was stressed, and my friend saw me while I was walking towards the plot. She went with me, and I told her how much doing the plot helped my well-being through all the stress and anxiety I went through during the semester. When I told her what we do in class, she was surprised. And after our conversation, I felt more comfortable.

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IF I COULD CHANGE 2-3 THINGS ABOUT THE COURSE TO IMPROVE IT, I WOULD CHANGE THESE THINGS...

The first thing I would like to change is the plot. The reason I want to make some changes is that doing the plot is a very important thing and a learning process. However, I felt that I lacked most of the knowledge needed to do something like that. Although we used AI and Google Lens to help us, I felt we needed a human being who could explain everything to us. Therefore, I would like to dedicate some classes to the plot and bring guest speakers to talk more about this experience and how we can take care of the plants. Also, some of the class should go to the plot together so that everyone can help each other if they are stuck in something.

Another thing I would like to change is the way schools visit. I would like to make some of the school visits at AUC in addition to going to school. I think this will help the students get more insights and make them more active. It will also help us to create and plan for more active lessons and activities, as I think it will give them different experiences and foster the outcome. I think visiting the AUC and experiencing the active learning classrooms would be a valuable opportunity for them to participate in different kinds of learning activities that are more interactive and meaningful. For example, we make activities for the on the board like we do in class and many other things that could give them valuable meaning.

Lastly, I would increase the intercultural experience by having classes similar to what we did with the German students. That is because we were exposed to different cultures, perspectives, and ways of learning. I would also like each student to make a presentation about topics they are interested in and present it to the class or to another class. For example, one of our classes presents a topic for the German students. I think this will make a difference in the learning experience for all students, as I know that we learn more when we teach something to others.
